

10 A RESOLUTION CONCERNING
20 THE PASSING OF A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT
30 BANNING HUMAN CLONING IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

40 WHEREAS: Cloning may lead to eugenics, which is genetic engineering to improve the
50 human race; and,

60 WHEREAS: Cloning could lead to new mutations in the gene pool; and,

70 WHEREAS: A clone might have fewer rights than other people; and,

80 WHEREAS: Cloning will lead to organ harvesting and breeding children for their
90 organs; and,

100 WHEREAS: Cloning alters the traditional concept of family; and,

110 WHEREAS: Clones could be used in the workforce, as slaves, or even bred to build
120 “super-human” armies; and,

130 WHEREAS: Parents will use cloning to make a copy of a dying or dead child; and,

140 WHEREAS: Adults will use cloning to make a copy of themselves; and,

150 WHEREAS: Cloning is morally wrong and the United States needs to ensure that it will
160 be banned in this country.

170 THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Maryland Student Legislature urges the
180 United States Congress to pass a Constitutional Amendment to ban the
190 cloning of humans at any time during development.
