10 **A RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE STATE’S DRIVER’S EXAMINATION**

20 **WHEREAS:** On average, applicants fail the test at least once before passing; and,

30 **WHEREAS:** After many failed attempts, such drivers are still allowed to drive on city
40 streets and highways.

50 **WHEREAS:** An inability to pass such an exam multiple times presents a faulty trend in
60 the potential driver.

70 **WHEREAS:** MVA states “If you fail to pass the road test, you can try again the
80 following business day. You can do this up to three times. After that, you'll need
90 to wait at least one week to try again” implying no restrictions on how many times
100 a test can be taken and/or failed.

110 **WHEREAS:** Correcting the examination ethics will help lower this trend.

120 **THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:** That the Maryland Student Legislature urges the
130 General Assembly to reform MVA examination to require further schooling if an
140 applicant fails the driver’s test 3 times.

150 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:** For the MVA to require at least a 3 month waiting
160 period before an applicant may apply again after repeated failures.
