10 **A RESOLUTION CONCERNING RETURNING GRADED ASSIGNMENTS TO**
20 **STUDENTS IN MARYLAND PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES**

30 **WHEREAS:** Teachers and professors have the obligation to return graded assignments,
40 such as exams and essays, to students promptly.

50 **WHEREAS:** Some teachers and professors do not return graded assignments in a
60 prompt manner, sometimes waiting over a month to return a single graded assignment.

70 **WHEREAS:** Some students will learn better and remember more if graded assignments
80 are returned to them within a short amount of time.

90 **WHEREAS:** Students are given deadlines to submit assignments to teachers and
100 professors, but teachers and professors do not have a deadline to return graded
110 assignments.

120 **THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:** That the Maryland Student Legislature urges
130 the Maryland General Assembly to require a set time frame, as determined by the length
140 of the given assignment and level of the class, to return assignments that has been
150 submitted to a teacher or professor for grading.
